Guide for Authors

Please prepare your paper based on these templates

To submit a manuscript, first make sure you have a Word File from which the title page and all author-identifying references have been removed. Acknowledgements of others' help in preparing the paper for submission should be send by separate Word File. In order to facilitate processing of submissions, please make sure that:

- There is nothing in your file that identifies the authors.
- Your entire submission (including references) is double-spaced in 12-inch or larger font with margins of one inch or more.
- Your submission contains few and only necessary footnotes or endnotes.
- Constructs and variables are identified in words, not abbreviations.

Content and length of manuscripts

- 1. The Editor welcomes original articles which fall within the aims and scope of the Journal, and which are as concise as the subject matter and research method permit.
- 2. The manuscripts language should be English and where possible the text should be restricted to around 6000 to 8000 words.
- 3. The first page of the text should begin with the title only, without the author's name, and an abstract of no more than 250 words. Plus a list of at most five key words, suitable for indexing and abstracting services. This abstract should summarize the whole paper and not the conclusions alone.
- 4. Manuscripts should be typed double-spaced.
- 5. Submission of a paper or research note implies that it contains original work which has not been published previously, and that is not under consideration for publication elsewhere.
- 6. Copyright in all accepted contributions to the Journal will be vested in the CESIR.

Mode of submission

7. All manuscripts should be submitted electronically via the IJCE online electronic website.

Preparation of manuscripts

8. A cover page should give the title of the manuscript, the author's name, position and institutional affiliation, together with an address for correspondence; in the case of co-authors, names and affiliations and addresses should be clearly indicated. Correspondence will be sent to the first-named author unless otherwise specified. In order to enable the publisher to do everything to ensure prompt publication, the full postal and email addresses should be given for the author who will check the proofs, along with the telephone, telex and telefax numbers where possible. Any desired acknowledgements should also be placed on the cover page.

To assure anonymous review, authors should not identify themselves, directly or indirectly, in the text following the cover page.

- 9. Figures, tables and footnotes should be placed within the text and should be reasonably interpretable without reference to the text. Footnotes should be avoided if possible; where they are used they should be numbered consecutively with superscript English numerals.
- 10. With regard to manuscripts which refer to questionnaires or other research instruments which are not fully reproduced in the text, the author may also submit a copy of the complete research instrument. Where research instruments are not fully reproduced, a note must be inserted on the cover page indicating the address from which the complete instrument is available.
- 11.Literature citations should be made in a uniform style in text and footnotes, and follow the APA System with (Name, Date) in the text and an alphabetical list of references at the end of the manuscript.
- 12. Please include a short author biography of 50-75 words to accompany the article.

The Financial Requirements for Publication in IJCE

According to the decision made by the General Assembly of Comparative Education Society of Iran (CESIR), manuscripts submitted to IJCE for review and possible publication will be processed only when the following conditions are met:

- 1. International contributors submitting to IJCE will not be charged for the review process or for publication.
- 2. For Iranian contributors, upon submission and after screening by IJCE editors,

- 100,000 Tomans should be deposited in the account number 333063352 or Card no. 5859837000085239 at Tajarat Bank.
- 3. After final acceptance issued by the journal, 300,000 Tomans should be wired into the above bank account for publication as well.

Please make sure that a copy of your payment receipt is attached to your submission as an image file (upload it on to the journal site). It should be noted that all deposits are non-refundable.

- 14. No manuscript or figures will be returned unless a request for return is made when the manuscript is submitted.
